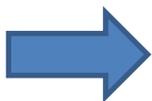

Literacy and Basic Skills agencies have been working on the full implementation of the Ontario Adult Literacy Curriculum Framework (OALCF) since April 2012. During the past year, CLO conducted key informant interviews and held a focus group with community-based literacy agencies in order to determine how agencies are marketing their services to external stakeholders.

- Communicating with external stakeholders



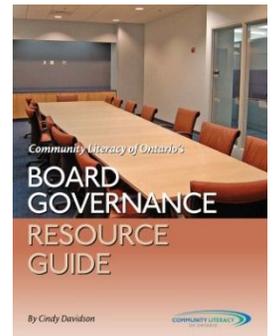

Date: Thursday, 21 February 2013 at 2:00 PM (EST)

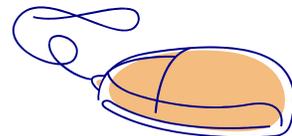

In this session, we will take a look at buying a computer or laptop and review processors, video cards and some of the input and output options.

Date: Thursday, 28 February 2013 at 2:00 PM (EST)

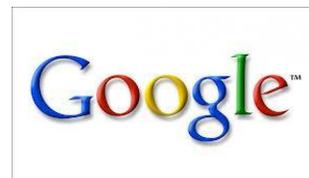

3. Google Docs

Most of us are now aware of Google's free document service but knowing how to effectively leverage the service can be tricky. One of the biggest advantages to Google Docs is the ability to collaborate with multiple people online and share your documents in real time as you make changes. We'll show you how to share your various documents so that people can view your document and so that they can make changes. We'll also give you an overview of the types of documents available and some basic pointers on using the software in general.

UPDATE ON CLO'S WEBSITE AND THANK YOU TO THE NATIONAL ADULT LITERACY DATABASE!

Community Literacy of Ontario's website has been hosted and maintained by the National Adult Literacy Database (NALD) for the past 15 years. NALD has been an **excellent friend** to the literacy community for many years. NALD received funding from the Federal Government under the Office Literacy and Essential Skills (OLES) to develop and maintain literacy websites. Unfortunately, last year, the Federal Government elected to withdraw funding from NALD for website development and support to the literacy community. Community Literacy of Ontario was **extremely** disappointed by this decision since NALD's website services provided critical support to many literacy agencies across Canada, including CLO. Thankfully, NALD's online library and other services they provide will still receive funding from the Federal Government.

Because of NALD's strong commitment to literacy, their Board of Directors has elected to still *host* literacy websites despite the withdrawal of funding from the Federal Government. However, NALD is no longer able to *develop and update* literacy websites effective April 1, 2013. Starting in April, CLO's website will be still hosted by NALD; however, our website content will now be maintained by GreenIT as part of their social enterprise. We will also be moving our website to WordPress.



In the coming months, you will notice that CLO's website has a new URL: www.communityliteracyofontario.ca. However, all of our current URLs will still work and will be linked to the new site.

THE ONTARIO BRANCH OF THE INTERNATIONAL DYSLEXIA ASSOCIATION

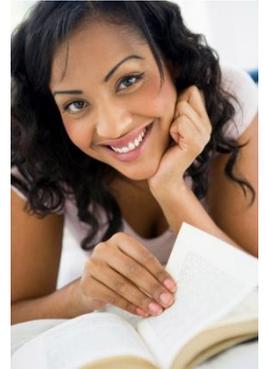
