Online Recording of CLO's Fall 2011 OALCF Implementation Training

In order to increase accessibility, Community Literacy of Ontario is pleased to provide an online, recorded version of the fall 2011 OALCF (Ontario Adult Literacy Curriculum Framework) Implementation Training. This recording is now available on Centra.

This training looks at the newest OALCF support tools. These tools include the Learner Plan Template, Goal Path Descriptions, Service Coordination and Referrals and a Schematic and Summary of the OALCF Tools and Resources available on the EOPG website. This training will also take a preliminary look at Culminating Tasks and Milestones and their relationship to the assessment process.



This training is freely available to literacy practitioners from all sectors and can be used by staff, volunteers and other stakeholders.

CLO's online training is divided into two sessions.

OALCF Fall 2011 Training Session 1 covers:

- How to Navigate OALCF Tools and Resources on the EOPG website in relation to the five service delivery functions
- What the new *OALCF Tools and Resources Summaries* document is and its contents
- What the new *An Introduction to the Goal Path Descriptions for Practitioners and Learners* document is and why it was developed
- What the **five Goal Path Description documents** contain and their intended purpose
- What the *Instructions for the Learner Plan Template* document is and why it was developed
- What the new *Learner Plan Template* will look like and the information that practitioners will be expected to document
- How the information in the *Learner Plan Template* will be collected, saved and shared

OALCF Fall 2011 Training Session 2 covers:

- What the *Supporting Learners through Service Coordination* document is and why it was developed
- What *Milestones* are and how they will be used in assessment
- What *Culminating Tasks* are and how they will be used in assessment
- How to give feedback to MTCU about the OALCF tools and resources

To access the recorded version of the Fall 2011 OALCF workshops, follow these steps:

1. Go to <http://e-channel-login.ca>.
2. Click on "public recordings" in the top left corner.
3. From the list of recordings, choose the workshop you want to listen to. The titles of CLO's workshops are as follows:
 - CLO's Fall 2011 OALCF Training **Part 1** – Session 2 (2 hours and 12 minutes in length)
 - CLO's Fall 2011 OALCF Training **Part 2** – Session 2 (2 hours and 5 minutes in length)
4. Click "playback" to the right of the name of the recording.
5. You will then need to enter your email address. Click "playback".
6. **If you are already registered with Contact North**, you will see your email address and you will be prompted to enter your password and click "playback" again.
7. **If you are NOT registered with Contact North**, you will need to enter your first and last name and then click "playback".
8. Click "playback in browser". After the workshop loads (this can take a bit of time depending on your connection speed), you will see the first slide and the workshop will begin automatically after a few seconds. Use the pause, play, fast forward, rewind and other controls to move through the workshop.
