Literacy-Employment Connections

 Early identification and resolution of a client's academic needs improves participation rates and improves chances for client success LBS + ES =
service coordination =
client success =
good stats = happy funder

What does an LBS client look like?

- ESL client?

- Client with a learning disability?

Promising Practices

- Increase face-time between LBS and ES staff
- Partner key staff from LBS and ES to work together.
 For example: meet to collaborate, examine partnering opportunities, develop a mutual work-plan and share best practices

Partnership Benefits

- These partnerships will increase trust and confidence between LBS and ES staff which will lead to meaningful and successful referrals
- This can also increase ES staff's understanding of literacy tools and resources and how to promote literacy services to clients

How does it work?

- Leverage resources!
- Ask what you can do for your LBS neighbours!
- Ask what you get in return!
- Work together to develop a work-plan...
- Please remember... there are definate capacity issues

Job Retention

- Increase connections between front line ES staff, LBS staff, Job Developers and employers
- Inform ES staff of the flexibility of LBS training:
 - Client can access LBS training before and during employment
 - LBS training can be directly related to the client's employment (i.e., policies and procedure binders, etc.)


