




Ontario Works & LBS Tweet Chat:

INVITATION FROM BOW VALLEY COLLEGE TO PARTICIPATE IN WRITE FORWARD NATIONAL PILOT

Bow Valley College, Adult Literacy Research Institute, invites you to participate in the national pilot of write forward. The pilot will run from September 15 to November 15, 2015.

writeforward is an informal, low stake writing assessment for use with adult literacy learners. It provides a formative assessment model for adult literacy practitioners to assess their learners' writing skills and provide "constructive guidance about how to improve" (Fenwick and Parsons, 2009).

writeforward is based upon Employment and Social Development Canada's (ESDC) Literacy and Essential Skills framework, adult learning principles, formative assessment and current Writing Theory about teaching adult literacy learners to write. writeforward is aligned with Level 1 and Level 2 of Employment and Social Development Canada's (ESDC) Literacy and Essential Skills framework. The complexity levels, contexts, and categories of tasks are all referenced to this framework.

writeforward has 57 authentic easy-to-use adult writing exercises. Each exercise has a customized Rubrics which focusses on writing skills and supports the development of writing strategies and increased confidence and knowledge about writing.

Bow Valley College is looking for college and community settings to use the orientation videos, core materials and the Exercises and Rubrics. Pilot sites will also be asked to participate in an evaluation of the resource. Upon project completion all materials will become a free downloadable resource, similar to readforward.


