


"BUILDING THE WORKFORCE OF TOMORROW" REPORT

Ontario's LBS Support Organizations believed that it was important to craft a response to the "Building the Workforce of Tomorrow" report. Our response was sent to The Honourable Deb Matthews, Minister of Advanced Education and Skills Development (MAESD).

In our response, we highlighted the strengths of the LBS program and how LBS has a role to play in meeting some of the needs identified in the report. The group believed that responding to this report will help to raise the profile of LBS within MAESD. We have also requested a meeting with Minister Matthews.
