CLO'S TRAINING DAY AND AGM 2017



Literacy Link Niagara's Reverse Mentoring Project

Adult Literacy programs across Ontario are seeing an increase in unemployed and under-employed clients looking to upgrade their digital literacy skills in order to enhance their job skills and employment prospects. Literacy programs often lack the resources (time, staff, and money) to meet the needs of these clients. Youth may have these digital literacy skills, but may lack experience in volunteer or employment positions.



In order to meet these needs, Literacy Link Niagara (LLN) developed the "Reverse Mentoring Project". With proper materials and coaching, LNN paired young people in Niagara with those looking to increase their digital literacy skills, making both parties more equipped for employment and more attractive to employers.
